



GRAFTON PACK 107 CODE OF CONDUCT

Pack 107 has established the following Code of Conduct to provide Scouts, Scouters, and parents with a framework of expectations and disciplinary actions for the whole Pack. This Code of Conduct will help ensure a common understanding for behavioral expectations and consequences, allowing us to create an atmosphere that is fun, safe, and reflects the values of Scouting.

Cub Scouts

- Always be on time
- Notify your den leader if you will be unable to attend a den meeting or outing
- Proudly wear a proper uniform that is clean, neat, and complete to all Scouting events
- Listen and pay attention during all meetings and outings
- When the Scout Sign is raised, respond with the Scout Sign, stopping what you are doing, paying attention, and remaining silent
- Respect your peers, parents, and leaders
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself
- Abide by the Scout Oath and Scout Law
- Abide by the Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace Principles
- Always follow and listen to your leaders
- DO YOUR BEST!

Parents

- Assist your Scout in learning and following the Pack 107 Code of Conduct
- Work with Den and Pack leaders to ensure all Scouts are following the Code of Conduct
- Act as role models, demonstrating proper behaviors, language, etc.
- Listen and pay attention during all meetings and outings
- When the Scout Sign is raised, respond with the Scout Sign, stopping what you are doing, paying attention, and remaining silent
- Parents are responsible for the conduct of any siblings during all Pack meetings and outings
- Parents may be asked to remove disruptive Scouts or children from these events
- Parents should accompany all Lions and Tigers to every meeting or outing
- Cub Scouting is a family based program and we encourage parent participation in all events
- The use of alcohol, tobacco, and illegal substances are PROHIBITED at all Scouting events

Scouters

- Abide by the BSA's Scouter Code of Conduct
- Abide by the Scout Oath and Scout Law
- Abide by the Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace Principles
- Treat all Cub Scouts as individuals, respecting their unique needs and capabilities
- Proudly wear a proper uniform that is clean, neat, and complete to all Scouting events
- Assume responsibility for the safety, well being, and behavior of your Scouts at all times
- Follow BSA rules regarding discipline and other matters
